Automotive Service Technician “Red Seal”

Credential:

The trade is recognized in B.C. and an Industry Training Authority Certificate will be issued at the completion of each of the four levels, and upon successful completion of fourth level and the Red Seal Examination, an Inter-Provincial Red Seal Endorsement will also be issued.

Duration:

Each level typically takes 1 year to complete.

Program Completion Requirements:

Completion of 1500 hours in the workplace (for each level) and sponsor (employer) attestation.

Successful completion of in-school technical training for each level. Number of hours required for each level is shown with technical training content that follows.

TECHNICAL TRAINING CONTENT

Level 1: (210 in-school hours)

- Safety
- Vehicle Maintenance
- Suspension
- Basic Electrical
- Brakes

Level 2: (180 in-school hours)

- Engines
- Intermediate Electricity
- Starter/Charging Systems
- Air-Conditioning Handling

Level 3: (210 in-school hours)

- Fuel Injection Systems
- Electronic Ignition Systems
- Emission Systems
- Advanced Electronics

Level 4: (180 in-school hours)

- Drive Trains
- Electronic Controls
- Air-Conditioning
- Future Technologies
